

Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Planning

May 7, 2014 Meeting notes

--CFLR must be a forest-wide effort (including portions of the Lassen National Forest and the Tahoe National Forest)

--A risk assessment map should be prepared that includes fire condition classes

--Data must be shared between PC FSC, USFS, Plumas County

--A new website must be developed to provide a platform to engage residents, landowners and collaborators in the process. The website update process should follow this progression:

- Development of maps (including voluntary stakeholder data)
- Development of new webpage to be hosted on the PC FSC website/USFS PNF website that contains information on the CFLR process
- Showcase groups that are implementing proactive management in the region (private industrial, private residential, NRCS Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQUIP), PC FSC HFR reduction projects)

USFS PNF FY 15 notes:

Focus at this time is on the fire settlement areas-Moonlight, Chips, Pendola, Rich. These projects are a high priority for the PNF through 2017.

Priority watersheds are the MFFR

Mt. Hough/Keddie Ridge, China Grade, Round Valley, Bucks, Twain/Butterfly Valley are areas that are receiving a lot of attention by the USFS at this time for HFR projects.

Washington D.C. wants to see 60-88% of funds spent on HFR in the WUI

--PC FSC will work to engage private industrial landowners, will work to gather GIS data from all parties and to consolidate this information into a central GIS database (includes polygons of HFR treatment areas-especially in the WUI)
